

What are School-Based Health Centers?

PCHS has partnered with local schools to provide primary medical and behavioral health services to students and their families. Giving kids and teens access to health centers at school puts them in a better position to learn.



School-based health centers provides a crucial link between health and education, improving outcomes for students in both areas. With youth-focused health education and services available at school, students are more likely to stay healthy, feel supported, be in class ready to learn, and graduate.

By having health care accessible at the schools:

- Students benefit because they don’t have to travel to find a provider or counselor.
- The child’s caregiver benefits because they don’t have to take a day off work or spend time waiting to be seen at a clinic.
- Schools benefit because students spend more time in the classroom.

Advantages of School Based Health Centers

Offers a wide range of services, such as:

- Evaluation and treatment of common health problems
- Sports Physicals
- Preventative Health Care
- Tobacco/Vaping cessation counseling
- Social Health Care
- Suicide Screening
- Emotional Health Care
- No wait times
- Caregivers can accompany children
- Caregivers can sign a consent form for children to be seen without requiring them to be present
- A visit summary can be electronically sent to the caregiver after patient's visit is completed
- Referrals to other health care providers can be arranged as needed
- Patients can be seen without leaving school, providing more time in the classroom
- Caregivers do not have to leave work/home, cutting down time traveling to appointments.
