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A WORD FROM THE CEO - 2022

The global pandemic started to fade into the background and recovering to normalcy began in earnest. Schools returned to in-person, venues reopened for arts and sporting events, and people who had delayed their routine health care returned in force. PCHS continued to see patients during the pandemic upheaval and then warmly welcomed patients who had not been seen for some time. PCHS continued its community role, providing COVID vaccines through scheduling mass vaccination days and mobile vaccination efforts. PCHS is extremely fortunate to have a dedicated team of employees who are here to “treat patients like family” and provide the same quality of care and concern that each of us would want for ourselves and loved ones.

In 2022, we continued to grow in size and scope under our Board of Director’s leadership and direction to meet even more of our community’s needs. PCHS moved Wheaton Way’s clinical staff and services to the completed Clare Avenue clinic which added eight new dental operatories. The new PCHS-owned building will serve people for years to come. Three school-based health centers were added to bring the total to ten. PCHS is now in every local school district where we also have traditional clinic sites. More mobile clinics rolled in and expanded our fleet and services across the region. Pendleton Place, a supportive housing program with Kitsap Mental Health Services (KMHS), opened in early 2022 with PCHS alongside to provide medical services to its 72 residents. We also purchased the building at 810 6th Street, Bremerton, to renovate as the future Medical Respite facility where unhoused people can recover after hospitalization and illness. Construction began at the Bay Vista property, starting with a parking lot to house the mobile fleet. In future years, Bay Vista will become PCHS’ main site for administration, the patient service center, information systems, warehouse, mobiles, and more.

In addition to these many exciting expansions, PCHS showed up all over the community to support events, to provide health education, to help people navigate to insurance coverage, and to help the community know all the different ways PCHS is here to help people thrive. We started asking our patients about their social needs and helped people become connected to assistance for housing, food, transportation, and more.

PCHS provides whole-person care, and it is the dedication of our staff, community partners, patients, and the community itself that makes the magic happen. Thank you for supporting our services and making PCHS a trusted provider of choice! I am so grateful for all of you!

PENDLETON PLACE

Pendleton Place opened in early 2022 and was the first large permanent supportive housing site for homeless adults who have severe mental illness or substance use disorders in Kitsap County.

As an organization with an emphasis on meeting community needs, we began partnering with Kitsap Mental Health Services at Pendleton Place to provide primary care services to all of its residents.

MEDICAL RESPITE

Our Board of Directors voted to add a stand-alone medical respite service center in early 2022.

In June, we purchased the former location from the Kitsap Rescue Mission on 6th Street in Bremerton to renovate for the developing program.

We have plans to provide a 22 unit regional recuperative care center in 2024.

NEW SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS

We launched three school-based health centers; at Kingston High School, Bremerton High School, and Olympic High School, offering medical and behavioral health services to students.

With these three new additions, we now have school-based health center networks in **five school districts!**

FAMILY DENTAL CLINIC

We purchased Lindquist Dental Clinic in Bremerton which closed its doors at the end of 2021. We reopened the location as a family dental office in early 2023.

The purchase was supported by the co-located Boys & Girls Club and the Bremerton School District, both community partners on the campus.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

Community outreach events began to open up again with relaxation of pandemic measures.

We partnered with schools to host back-to-school events for students to receive wellness exams and sports physicals, hosted an array of open enrollment events, set up booths at farmers markets across the peninsula, and presented screening events for our patients with the support of Managed Care Organizations.

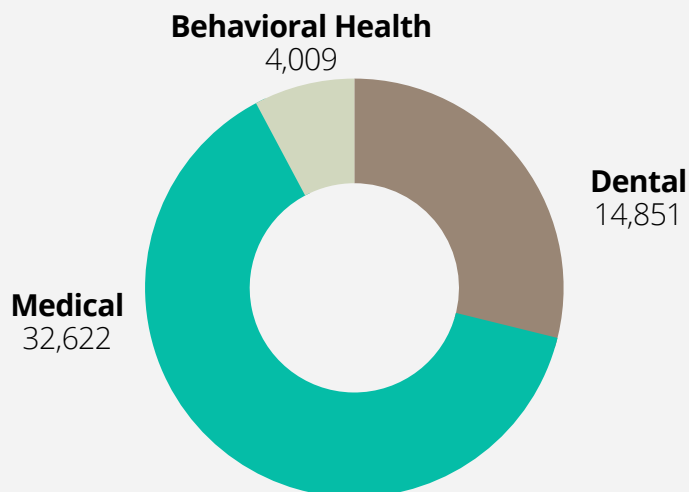

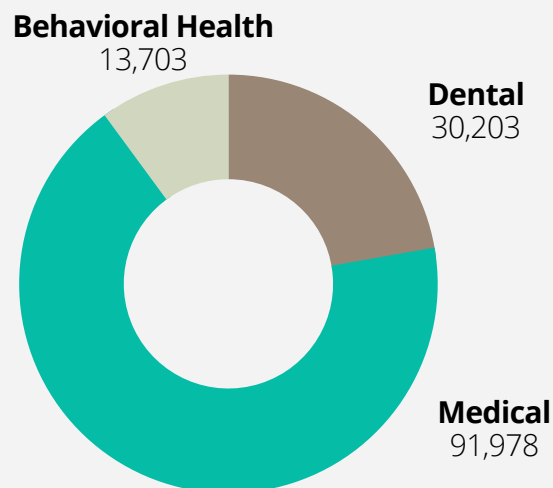

Total Patients: 40,007

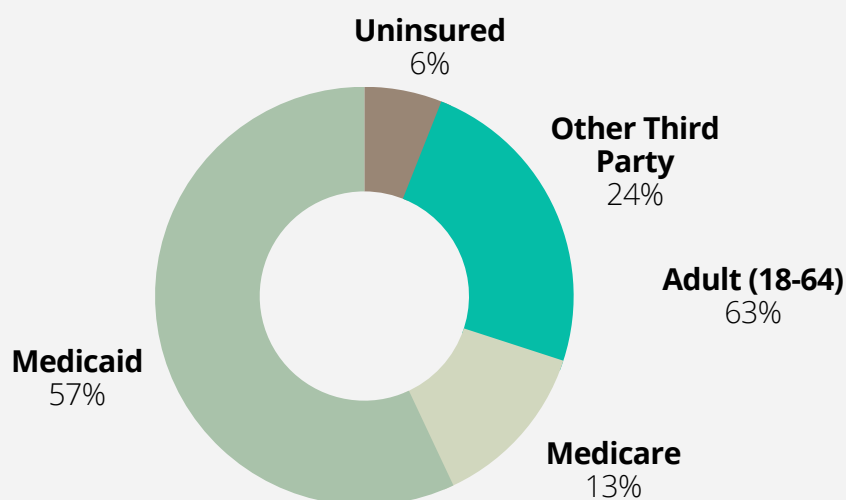
Number of Patients Using Services



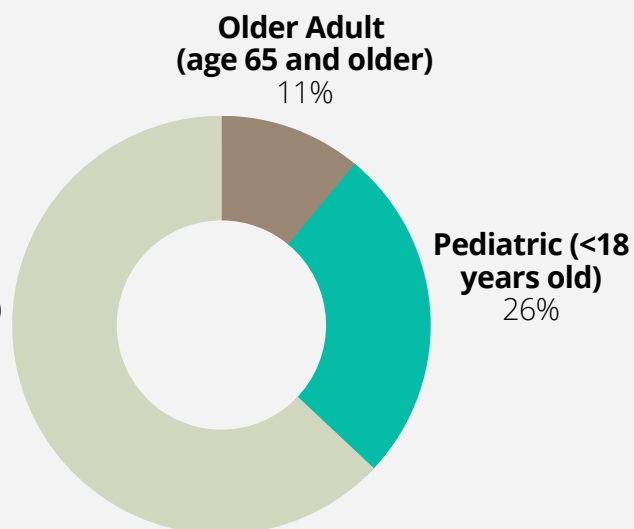
Total Encounters
